Arthur had a difficult start to life. At just six months old he needed open heart surgery, during which he suffered a stroke which left him with a brain injury. After ten weeks in hospital Arthur came to The Children's Trust.

His mum Laura tells us: "I'm not going to lie, it was pretty scary. We were coming straight from a hospital setting and were very nervous. We just wanted all the hurt and pain to go away and dreaded being in another clinical environment."

Arthur worked hard during his time at The Children's Trust, making the most of a full timetable of physiotherapy, speech and language therapy and occupational therapy. Despite further medical complications and emergency hospital stays, Arthur made amazing progress and went home able to walk, eat and drink independently.

Now Arthur attends mainstream school and continues his therapies at home. He loves spending time with his friends, singing and dancing, and most of all his new baby brother!
